AN IMPORTANT NOTE TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS REGARDING *Education Code Section 49423* Medications (both prescription and non-prescription) to be administered at school require **BOTH** the physician’s signature and parent/guardian signature authorizing designated school personnel to dispense such medication. ***Please obtain a PERMISSION TO GIVE MEDICATION form from the School Secretary if your child is required to take medication during the regular school day.*** All medications, excepting those which must be kept on the student’s person for emergency use, must be kept and distributed by staff. ***Medication must be brought to school in the original container with printed instructions on the label.***
